### LTAP WORKSHOPS

Motor Grader Operator Workshops, Wednesday, 5/7 (Webster City); Thursday, 5/8 (Ainsworth); Tuesday, 5/13 (Storm Lake); Wednesday, 5/14 (Chariton); and Thursday, 5/15 (Atlantic) – Motor Grader Operator (MoGO) training is a one- or two-day program led by experienced operators who teach others efficient and safe operating practices. The classroom session primarily focuses on blading techniques for different tasks, roadway/roadside cross-section elements, safety, and equipment. Participants are often from several cities or counties, which promotes discussion and exchange of ideas and techniques. The optional field session for new operators attending a classroom session in 2025 is expected to occur the week of 8/11–8/15 at the lowa Army National Guard Base, Camp Dodge in Johnston. MUTCD 2023 Overview, Wednesday, 5/14 (Cedar Rapids); Thursday, 5/15 (Waverly); Tuesday, 5/20 (Ames); Wednesday 5/21 (Atlantic); Thursday, 5/22 (Storm Lake); and Wednesday, 6/5 (Fairfield) – A new national Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) came out in 2023. This workshop will include a summary of some of content and the changes in the 2023 MUTCD. More specifically, presentations will focus on parts of the MUTCD related to its introductory general content (Part 1) and the installation of locally relevant regulatory, warning, and guide signs (Part 2). In addition, information related to school area (Part 7), railroad (Part 8) and bicycle facility (Part 9) signs will also be covered. More limited amounts of material may also be covered for other types of signs (e.g., changeable message), pavement markings (Part 3), and traffic signals (Part 4). Temporary traffic control (Part 6) material is covered in other workshops. NOTE: States that have their own MUTCDs or Supplements have two years to do revisions, and this process is currently ongoing.
